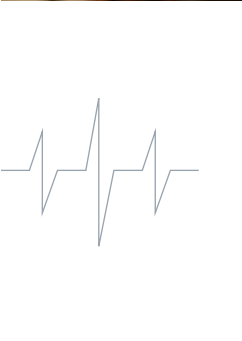

Answer general questions

What's the drug supposed to do? We'll explain how it typically works for your condition.
